P5/6 BEAM Workshop

P5/6 will be taking part in an antisocial behaviour workshop run by BEAM on the 11th January. BEAM provide outreach educational-based workshops that focus on exploring life and social issues through art.

Lessons will take place at Ballysillan Leisure Centre. Children will be walking to and from the Leisure centre and it is important that they have a warm waterproof coat with them.


The times will be as follows: Primary4/5-10am Primary 6 -10.30am Primary 7 -11am

How to Apply to Nursery or Primary 1...

- 1) Please go to http://www.eani.org.uk/parents/admissions
- 2) Select Nursery or Primary
- 3) Register to receive a username and password. (if you registered to apply for nursery-please use these details)
- 4) Login with username and password. (if you applied to Nursery last year it should be the same details)
- 5) Register your child's details.
- 6) Select your first choice of either Nursery or Primary School.
- 7) You must select and fill up all other choices (make sure they are in order of preference 1,2,3,4)
- 8) You must upload all supporting documentation-birth certificates and benefit forms.
